8 Hour Food Protection Manager Certification Course Enrollment Form

The Greene County Health Department host several 8-hour Food Protection Manager (FPM) course and exams annually. Classes are held at Greene County Health Department (GCHD), 310 Fifth Street, Carrollton, IL. Interested participants should refer to the schedule posted on the website. Instruction provided by Liz Stemm, GCHD Environmental Health Inspector. Lunch will be on your own from 12:00 noon till 1:00 pm and 2 – 15 minutes breaks, 10:00 am and 2:15 pm.

The 8-hour course includes a self-study textbook (to be purchased and read before scheduled class date), 7 hours of classroom review, the exam, and a 5-year FPM certificate upon successfully passing the exam. The registration fee is \$ 135.00 (see below for different rates).

Anyone wishing to enroll in a class must register and pre-pay one week before scheduled course date at the GCHD. Payment may be made by cash, a check made payable to the GCHD or a credit card (applicable fees will be applied) and will be accepted prior to registration deadline or if capacity limit has been met.
