COMMUNITY HEALTH



Health protection is an essential component of public health that usually goes unseen until an issue occurs. We conduct routine inspections, address complaints, conduct educational events, and assist with the openings of establishments. Programs and services include, but are not limited to:

HOME HEALTH





Home Health provides part-time or intermittent nursing services as ordered by the patient's physician for homebound patients due to disease or disability. The professional nurse can provide skilled nursing care for homebound patients. Coordinated discharge planning with the Doctors/hospitals/extended care facilities is a valuable tool to ensure a continuum of care and to help eliminate the need for re-hospitalization of the citizens of Greene County. The Department continues to serve those individuals needing skilled home health care services and has expanded coverage to Scott County.

PERSONAL HEALTH SERVICES




